Others Present: Ed Harris, Brian Burkholder, Shane Fox and Joel Young.

Ballfield Maintenance: Burkholder and Harris explained the historical practice of maintaining the ballfields in Mill Creek Park and at the School District. They suggested that the City and the District work together to contract for leveling, cutting and reshaping the fields and also to consider hiring someone to complete daily maintenance. Burkholder explained that it takes about two hours to spike and drag the fields. Additional work includes striping the fields. The Committee determined that the City and School District should continue to work on developing a solution together. A solution is desired to be in place by spring of 2022.

Mr. Harris and Burkholder will develop a list of tasks, the timing those tasks will take place during the year and will present to the Personnel Budget Committee.

Swimming Pool: Katie Goldsmith, manager of the swimming pool. Katie would like to condense the number of swimming lessons that are offered, but the evening sessions are valued. The price of private lessons should increase to \$100 and any groupings should be limited to immediate family members as opposed to different families sharing a "private" lesson.

Goldsmith suggests that pay should begin at \$12.00 per hour instead of the current \$10.00 and WSI positions should get paid more, too.

Open the pool with how many people? This point will continue to be discussed. She also suggested that we consider selling a card of a certain number of entry passes. Another idea offered would be to introduce a reciprocity agreement with another community or two. Goldsmith said that she would like to come back for another year.

Bandshell: Burkholder reported that he and Carmen Narveson are working together to get quotes for making improvements to the bandshell. They will continue to do so so Narveson can apply for a grant to make the improvements.

Blacktop & Roofs at Mill Creek Park: Burkholder presented plans to improve blacktop driveways and a path to the playground equipment. He will continue to develop these plans. Burkholder reported that roofs need to be replaced on the warming house, shelter at Mill Creek Park and the bleacher canopy on the south ballfield.

Dumping at Shady Oak Park: Tabled until next meeting.

Lone Stone Park Grant Award to Acquire Playground Equipment: The Committee reviewed the three proposals for playground equipment. Finnegan was cost of \$56,000, St. Croix cost was \$49,000 and \$48,444.

The bridge at Groen Park: Tabled to next meeting.

Her are my thoughts on this issue...

I do believe we need to provide a service to dump campers that are not staying at our city camp sites and I feel there are 2 things that we are talking about that are taking place.

- 1. Campers using the city camp site and the condition of the sewer service. It has plugged up 2 times in the past 2 years. the last occurrence cost \$524. After a camera was used and then cleaned out by the contractor, the comments stated that it was plugged with paper and the line was free flowing after completed. I was also told by Steven that t the 4" sewer line is off-set going to the street which could cause hang ups. Until it is repaired, it will work with those camping but not major dumps at one time.
- 2. To provide a service of dumping of non-site renters and in talking with Steven as well, from the (MPCA) that larger dumping other than site users' needs to be monitored and not allowed at the campsite as it can be abused with unlocked and accessible open holes. Since we have learned by campsite renters, that this has been happened more often and now have been locked and only unlocked when sites are being used by renters.

I believe the sites can be used as they have been in the past knowing that it could get plugged with the use as it is and do believe we should keep them locked to only paid users at \$15.00 a day. In talking with Steven, we believe that if a non-renter wants to dump that they call city hall or the WWTP to set up a time to dump at the WWTP Monday thru Friday 7:00 am to 3:00 pm with a \$15.00 charge. Currently that I am aware of is Preston does not have a site but Fillmore County does near the Preston plant that charges \$5.00. Stewartville does not currently have a fee because they have only been asked 1 time I the last 4 years so they allowed to dump at there WWTP in a manhole at no charge that one time. I believe a \$15.00 few would be appropriate for Chatfield because it is a service but also they could pay the \$15.00 few then we unlock it and either they stay or just dump and leave. A sign could be installed at Shady Oak stating a number to call, times, the location and the fee.

OK here are my thoughts!!!!

For probably 30 years or so we have told people that asked about dumping station for RV's the only place we have is The Shady Oak park camp site.

We have used this as a camp site for short term and longer term campers as a service to our citizens and visitors.

The one mistake I believe we made in building the new WW plant was to not include a dump site for RV's. If we are to be a full service community we need to provide this service to our camping tax payers and yes we should charge a fee for it somehow!

I have personally used this service twice this year and while it is not a great site it works for my small rig and small amount of waste water.

It would be unfortunate and in my mind not right to tell people this is the only spot we have, so you should use it to, you cannot use it as someone took advantage of the situation and now you cannot use it!

I think the facility needs to be updated and an alternative site provided for both RV's and commercial services if needed and a fee charged to use it.

Camping is big and looks to be a bigger issue in the future so the city should step up and create a service area for this!

I do believe that most campers are used to paying to dump their tanks and that a free service is not necessary but having a site for this purpose is important.

Action Requested: Discuss the potential installation of a pedestrian bridge in Groen Park.

Background Information: In 2022, it is expected that a streambank restoration project will take place on Mill Creek, from the Fillmore County Road 2 bridge to the end of Groen Park. This will stabilize the banks of the creek and improve trout habitat in that stretch of the creek.

This project would be an excellent time to acquire and install a pedestrian bridge across the creek, connecting both sides of Groen Park. The attached information is very preliminary, meaning that the materials and design of the bridge could evolve as necessary to meet the City's needs. While the cost of the streambank project will be covered by the agency responsible for that project, the cost associated with the bridge would be the City's responsibility.

Funding for the bridge might be a bit complicated. While the Park Reserve Fund does have a positive fund balance, there is not enough cash currently available to cover the entire cost of the bridge without interrupting other planned park purchases. The Reserve Fund does have \$50,000.00 as a result of a bequest made to the to the City in 2017, which was designated "for the improvement and maintenance of Groen Park." The bequest was made by the Alice Adelaide Whitford Revocable Trust.

One funding alternative would be to use the Minnesota Rural Water Association debt program to finance the additional cost of the project, paying that debt back over a five year period. Another approach would be to simply install the concrete abutments at this time so that the bridge could be acquired and installed at a future date, perhaps after securing a grant or conducting other fundraising efforts. In either case, the installation of a pedestrian bridge would open up the southwesterly portion of Groen Park for full use as a park. As such, that would create an opportunity for a citizen's group to create a development plan for that area.

See attached. I would estimate this bridge (including freight) to go for about \$79K, right now. Add around \$16K for abutments (assuming soils support the use of a spread footing). I've attached some photos of our Express Abutments....very easy to implement on a project.

Installation costs

Maybe \$30K to \$40K when you figure excavation/backfilling and setting the abutments and bridge?

Puts the total cost around \$130K for a quick guess? Hard to know, for sure, with all kinds of material escalations in play.







SUBJECT: Trade/Replace 2018 John Deere Front Deck Mower

DATE: 11/15/2021

Action Requested: To consider the trade and replacement of the 2018 John Deere front deck mower for a new front deck mower. Identical units.

Background: In the past years, we adjusted our mowers on the Parks Capital Plan to every 4 years instead of 5 years in the effort to reducing repair costs and to still receive decent trade in values. In these 4 years, it includes a warranty for 1,200 hrs. or 48 months. For the past 7-8 years, this has worked out pretty good with no major repairs needed besides tires, blades, or guide wheels.

I received a trade and purchase quote again from SEMA in St Charles and it fits into our plan. The total cost for replacement is \$16,238.59 which include the unit, rear discharge deck, gator blades and a full machine, 1,200 hour or 48-month warranty. Currently, the Capital Plan is showing \$16,974. If we order soon, it is showing the new mower arriving in Sept 2022, but they also state that sometimes orders are coming sooner. Another option would be that SEMA can look around at other dealers and see if one is available which I would assume that it would be a 2021 model. The Warranty on our current mower ends in June 2022.

Since the plan has been working well, my recommendation would be to trade and replace the 2018 model as soon as we are able in the hopes that we receive the new mower by June 2022.

Action Requested: To consider the installation of either concrete or blacktop at gravel areas around dugouts and bleachers in Mill Creek Park.

Background: After the new dugouts were installed, dirt was removed, and gravel was added to the areas between the dugouts and bleachers and to the shelter and hydrant to meet AD compliance.

Next year, I would like to consider to either blacktop or concrete those areas to be more permanent making it more user friendly for spectators and to also make it a more attractive complex.

I received 1 quote for blacktopping from Asphalt Amor who did some work in town for others this past year. They seemed to do a good job and are competitively priced. I also reached out to 3 concrete contractors for quotes. As of today, I have received 1 quote and another contractor did meet me there. I hope to receive a 2nd quote my Mondays meeting.

Comparing these 2 quotes, concrete is \$2,662 higher than blacktop, but concrete would have little to no future maintenance needed. If we were to consider either, I would recommend concrete as we would save maintenance cost (crack filling and sealcoating) every 4-5 years.
