GARBAGE BAG QUALITY & SUPPLY CHAIN ISSUES



The most recent shipment of the yellow garbage bags were not manufactured properly. According to the bag supplier, the seam sealing machine was not properly set or monitored, which has resulted in many bags with seams that give way. If you have any faulty bags, return them to the store to get replacement bags, and/or call Hanson Waste Removal (507-259-7124).

Also, supply chain issues are impacting the availability and cost of the specially marked garbage bags. The "bag system" is designed to both increase recycling efforts and to allow residents to control the cost of their garbage service as much as possible. Residents can reduce their cost of garbage collection by recycling more to reduce the amount of waste that is produced.

Due to supply chain problems, it is no longer possible to get yellow bags with custom imprinting on a timely basis or at a reasonable cost. With the hope that these problems will be resolved within the next year, the City has authorized Hanson Waste Removal to purchase a maroon colored bag in a quantity that will accommodate our needs for about a year.

Bags will continue to be available at Cenex, Kwik Trip and Sunshine Foods. The per bag price will remain the same however the packaging quantities may vary by store. Maroon bags will be replacing yellow bags as the existing inventory is used up.

Wm. Hanson Waste Removal and the City regret any inconvenience these issues might cause.

2022 PROPERTY TAXES AND FEES

Based on the preliminary tax levy that was established by the City Council in September, the City's tax levy will increase by no more than 3.9%. While water rates will increase a bit next year, sanitary sewer rates and garbage rates are not expected to increase.



PUBLIC WORKS—WINTER REMINDERS

Be a good Neighbor This Winter—Help Keep Roads & Sidewalks Clear

1 SHOVEL YOUR SIDEWALKS



Sidewalks need to be cleared of all snow and ice as quickly and completely as possible and at least within 24 hours of the weather event.

- The entire width of the sidewalk must be cleared of snow and ice, down to the concrete.
- Remember to clear curb ramps and crosswalks for wheelchairs and strollers.
- If you are leaving for an extended time, find someone to shovel your walks.

2 WINTER PARKING REMINDER

PLOWS AT WORK NO STREET PARKING



There is no parking on city streets when plows are operating to help us plow more safely and efficiently.

- Move your vehicle off of the street if you plan to leave town.
- Avoid a citation or having your vehicle towed by removing your vehicle from the street anytime it is snowing.

3 PREVENT FROZEN PIPES



Cold weather can freeze pipes leading to burst that can lead to costly repairs.

- Disconnect hoses from your outside faucets and shut off the valve for the outside faucet that is inside your house.
- Keep doors open to rooms that contain plumbing.
- Ask someone to check your place while you are away.
- If the temperature of the water collected in a cup after running for 10 minutes is 38 degrees or below start running your water with a stream the diameter of a pencil and notify City Hall at 507-867-3810 so water bills can be adjusted accordingly.
