Vote — Tuesday November 8th

Tuesday, November 8th—Polls will be open from 7:00 am—8:00 pm at Chatfield Center for the Arts—405 Main Street South, Chatfield MN 55923

In addition to state races on the general election ballot, this election will also fill City Council and Chatfield Public School Board seats.

The Mayor seat and two City Council seats will be filled in this election. The term of office for the Mayor is two years. The term of office for the City Council seats is four years.

Three seats are open for election for the Chatfield Public School Board. School Board terms of office are four years.

City Services, Taxes & The Budget

The City Council adopted the preliminary budget for operating the City in 2023, which will require a total tax levy of \$2,445,108, an increase of \$134,231 or 5.81%. The final tax levy will be set in December and must be equal to or less than the preliminary tax levy. In other words, the final tax levy might go down but it can't go up.

Other than typical operating cost increases, driven mostly by inflation, the additional costs included in the proposed 2023 budget includes \$25,000 for an initiative proposed by the Heritage Preservation Commission

(HPC) and \$50,000 for an additional public works employee. If an additional full-time public works employee is hired, the number of seasonal employees will be reduced. As for the HPC, that initiative is focused on providing an incentive to preserve and improve the building facades in the historic downtown business district.

The City Council will continue to work on the 2023 budget until December 12th, when a public hearing will be held and the final budget and tax levy will be adopted. That meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m.

Public Works Fall & Winter Reminders

- Fall street sweeping begins the week of 10/24. This process takes approximately two weeks. Please remove vehicles from the streets when you see the sweeper in your neighborhood.
- The brush & leaf dump will close with the first plowable snowfall.
- Remove all portable basketball hoops from the right -of-way and sidewalks before plowing season starts.
- Sidewalks need to be cleared as quickly and completely as possible after a snowfall.
- Please do not park on the City Streets if snow is in the forecast. Sign up for Citizen Alert Notifications at www.ci.chatfield.mn.us
- No parking on city streets when plows are operating. Tickets will be issued and cars may be towed if parked cars interfere with snow plowing or removal. We do our best to place a community announcement on KTTC & send a citizen alert the evening prior to plowing whenever the forecast warns us ahead of time. The best practice is to not park on the City Streets if snow is in the forecast.
