BUILDING PERMIT ADMINISTRATION

As of February 1, 2024, the Olmsted County Planning Department will be administering the building permit process for projects taking place within the City of Chatfield. To apply for a building permit, you can email, mail, or drop off your application and plans:

UTILITY BILL PAYMENT OPTIONS

- 1. **Auto Pay**—Sign up to have your utility bill withdrawn from your bank account each month. Call City hall to request a form or submit from the city web site.
- 2. Mail—City of Chatfield, 21 SE Second Street, Chatfield, MN 55923
- 3. **Drop Box**—Use the payment drop box located at the alley entrance of City Hall.
- 4. In Person At the Clerk's Office between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Mon-Fri.
- 5. *Online Payments can be made online visit www.ci.chatfield.mn.us
- 6. *Over the phone—You may call in with a credit / debit card or e-check to make your payment.

 *As of Feb. 2024 a 3.5% fee applies to all transactions processed through the RevTrak payment system.

 This incudes payments made by calling to pay over the phone.

DOG-WALKING ETIQUETTE



Following a few ground rules will help keep pets & people safe:

- 1. **Use a Leash**. While your dog may have excellent recall, there's no telling what might trigger them to bolt or involve them in a contentious situation with another dog or a person. Even though the city ordinance language includes at heel by command or leash, having your dog off leash is risky and may make others uncomfortable.
- 2. **Be Respectful**. This goes for people and property alike. Don't let your dog run up to or jump on other people; keep them close to you so others can pass you without the fear of falling. Also, keep them off neighborhood lawns. Landscaping is expensive and time-consuming, and dog pee is a lawn killer.
- 3. **Pick Up Your Dog's Poop**. It is unlawful to permit a dog (or cat) to defecate on any private property without consent or on any public property unless immediately removed and placed in a proper receptacle.

FIX A LEAK WEEK MARCH 18-24, 2024

EPA's annual Fix a Leak Week is celebrated each year as a reminder to check household fixtures and irrigation systems for leaks. Common types of leaks found in the home are worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets, and other leaking valves.

These types of leaks are often easy to fix, requiring only a few tools and hardware that can pay for themselves in water savings. Fixing easily corrected household water leaks can save homeowners about 10 percent on their water bills.

HERE ARE SOME TIPS FOR FINDING LEAKS:

- Take a look at your water usage during a colder month, such as January or February. If a family of four exceeds 12,000 gallons per month, there are serious leaks.
- Check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used. If the meter changes at all, you probably have a leak.
- Identify toilet leaks by placing a drop of food coloring in the toilet tank. If any color shows up in the bowl after 10 minutes, you have a leak. (Be sure to flush immediately after the experiment to avoid staining the tank.)
- Examine faucet gaskets and pipe fittings for any water on the outside of the pipe to check for surface leaks.
