Chapter 22, Section 22-28 Amendment

The current ordinance reads as follows:

Every householder or occupant of any dwellinghouse, boardinghouse, apartment house, mobile home or any other place of residence must availthemselves of the city's services and the approved contractor or solid wastecollector. Further, all nonresidential places, such as businesses and commercial places must avail themselves of the city-service-approved contractor. In the event the contractor shall not be able to properly dispose of the refuse or solid waste generated by any business or commercial place, such place of business may apply to the city for an exemption in order to beable to use a different contractor for such items.

However, our current city approved contractor agreement allows commercial, multi-family, and mixed-use properties to use other contractors.

Action Requested: Consider if the language in the current ordinance should be amended to read as follows:

All single family residential properties including mobile homes must avail themselves of the city's services and the approved residential contractor or solid wastecollector. All commercial, industrial, multi-family, and mixed-use properties may use another contractor provided the contractor is approved by the City Council.
