City Utility Bill... is your bill in the arrears?

Each year, the City of Chatfield is required to review all accounts and take action to bring them current. The past due accounts are presented to Council for assessment to the property taxes. If you have a property with a utility account in arrears, payment in full must be received or the balance will be assessed to your property taxes.

Lock the doors on vour home and vehicles (even when parked in

your driveway) and keep your garage doors closed.

Most homes and vehicles that have items stolen from them are unlocked. Most items stolen are also visible. If there is nothing visible to steal in your car, thieves usually won't break windows just to check. On the other hand, if you leave your doors unlocked, thieves will open the door and see what they can find. Secure your personal belongings and promptly report unusual activity by calling 9-1-1.

Signs Must Be on Private Property Only



City right-of-way includes public streets, bridges, medians, bike lanes, sidewalks boulevards and trails. Under the Minnesota state law (Minn. Stat. 160.2715) signs are not allowed to be placed on city road right-of-ways. In most cases where sidewalks are present, city

right-of-way extends to at least the edge of the sidewalk closest to private property.

Unlawfully placed signs on city right-of-way will be removed and held at the Public Works Shop. The Public Works Shop is located at 382 Main Street South.

What is an Rx drop box?

An Rx drop box is a secure receptacle designed for the safe disposal of unused or expired prescription and over-the-counter medications.

It's a convenient way to keep medications out of the wrong hands and prevent environmental contamination.
