

That type of contradiction, while simplistic as it is written here, is useful to describe the vast challenges of delivering police services on a day to day basis.

> McCormick was interested in building a stronger sense of trust and cooperation between the Department and those "we protect and serve." The Citizens' Academy and the Chief's Rap Sheet, efforts intended to further the "public partnership," were greatly appreciated by many.

He talks of the strong base of support that the Mayor and Council has for the police department as do many community residents. Chief McCormick has been proud to lead a well-trained and well educated group of officers and is confident that the community will continue to be well served.


